Reformation Conference 2022

This year we were able to organize another reformation conference after a break since the first event in 2019 due to the pandemic.

The theme of the conference was looking at the importance of the Bible and specifically looking at the use of the Reformation Study Bible. The Reformation Study Bible is a valuable resource especially in places where good commentaries are scarce.

We received 150 copies of the Reformation Study Bible from a generous donor and have been distributing them to pastors and church leaders. The conference was aimed at providing guidance on how the Reformation Study Bible can be used.

Speakers at the conference included rev. Makhalira of Christ Presbyterian Church in Blantyre, rev. dr. Kalengo of CCAP Nkhoma Synod, rev. Van Der Bas a missionary with the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Malawi, rev. Banda dean of students at the Reformed Presbyterian Church theological school, and rev. Matandika of Mponela Reformed Church ARPC.

Participants of the conference were mostly pastors and church elders from the Reformed Presbyterian Church and Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church in NkhataBay, Nkhotakota, Kasungu, Dowa, Lilongwe, Ntcheu, Blantyre and Mulanje.

Annual Reformed Women's Conference

FARMING GOD'S WAY

As one way of assisting members in our churches, Food for Life an organization dedicated solely to helping farmers with better methods of farming conducted a training course on conservation agriculture. A group of 7 farmers will be provided with maize seeds and organic manure. With the use of chemical fertilizers most soils have lost fertility and the use of organic manure is to help increase fertility rates thereby increasing yield.

As a church, we hope to continue working with this organization until most of our members have been successful in their food production. This is one of the best ways of battling hunger issues and reducing handouts.

October 2021 a satellite church site of Mponela Reformed Church was opened in a nearby village. The above picture shows a worship service in session in the village. The members of the church managed to get land which was bought by the funds saved by the church members. After the rain season earlier this year, they cleared the land and put a temporary shelter which they had been using up to November 2022.

Some members of the church had donated bricks for the church building and funds to start the construction work which was started in November. The building is now almost completed as the picture above shows and the difficult task of roofing is coming. It is amazing how the Lord provided for this project. We continue praying for the Lord's provision to complete the remainder of the work in His time.
